The children in the Ahava class are active learners. We work diligently to complete puzzles and read books on the classroom floor.

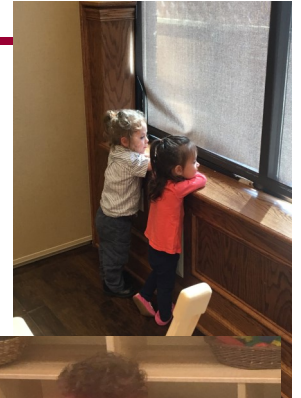
We test our building skills and let our imaginations soar. The children are learning yoga poses, down dog, cat, and cow. Have you seen these at home?
